#### **History of April 21**

- ♦ 1451: Bahlol Khan Lodi, the founder of the Lodi dynasty, became the ruler of Delhi.
- ▶ 1720 : Bajirao I succeeded Peshwa Balaji Vishwanath.
- 1996: Sanjay Thapar of the Indian Air Force was landed on the North Pole via parachute.
- ◆ 1924: Queen Elizabeth II, head of 54 nations and territories, was born.

#### **Current Affairs Related to 21th April**

- In May, NITI Aayog plans to launch a national data and analytics platform, which will deliver government data in a user-friendly manner and encourage data driven decision making and research. The platform, which was conceived in 2020, aims to standardize data across government sources and provide flexible analysis that allows users to easily analyze data using multiple datasets. At launch, the portal will have 200 datasets from over 46 ministries.
- ♣ India's first radio channel for visually impaired people, whose name is Radio Axis. Nagpur has been launched in Maharashtra. The 96-year-old Nagpur-based organization The Blind Relief Association Nagpur and Samasthi Capacity Development and Anusandhan Mandal are the organizations behind this idea. The channel will be available for free on various internet radio platforms. A dedicated team of trained volunteers, mostly women, help create content for the radio channel, which can be delivered to visually impaired people in India and around the world.
- ♦ Indonesia halts imports of agricultural products from India citing New Delhi authorities' failure to register laboratories that assess food safety and issue certificates of analysis, raising concerns among grain exporters .
- The government has excluded sectors such as iron, steel, chemicals and pharmaceuticals from the exemption scheme of duties and taxes on export products. These sectors were excluded from the plan as iron and steel were already at an advanced stage and the pharma industry also grew during the pandemic. The Scheme for Remission of Duties and Taxes on Export Products will refund to exporters such inherent central, state and local duties or taxes, which were hitherto either not exempted or not being refunded, thereby making India's Exporters were suffering.
- ◆ Lieutenant General Manoj Pandey, Deputy Chief of the Army Staff, has been appointed as the new Chief of Army Staff. Manoj Pandey will be the

- 29th Chief of Army Staff in the order. He will replace General Manoj Mukund Naravane for the post. General MM Naravane will retire on 30th April. It is to be noted that the term of chiefs is till the age of 62 years or till three years whichever is earlier. Lieutenant General Manoj Pandey was a serving General Officer in the Indian Army.
- According to a message from the ministry, Moskva, the flagship of Russia's Black Sea Fleet, was being escorted to the port when it sank due to stormy waves.
- ♦ About 167 people died in landslides and floods caused by Tropical Storm Magi that hit the Philippines. According to the National Disaster Organisation, 110 people are missing and 1.9 million people have been affected. Mountain avalanches and rushing rivers wreaked havoc in villages around the town of Bebe in central Leyte province.
- ♦ A potential vaccine is being developed in India against COVID-19 or SarsCov2 which does not require refrigeration or is stored in cold chain storage.
- ◆ Top Indian swimmer Sajan Prakash won the men's 200m butterfly gold medal at the Danish Open Swimming Meet in Copenhagen, Denmark. Participating in his international competition this year, Prakash stopped the clock at 1.59.27 to stand on the podium. Earlier, the Kerala swimmer had clocked 2.03.67 in the heat to qualify for the 'A' final.
  - Veteran Hindi television presenter and actress, Manju Singh has passed away due to cardiac arrest. She was one of the pioneers in the Indian television industry and was fondly remembered as Didi. She was the anchor of the children's program Khel Khilone for 7 years. He started his career as a television producer in 1983 with Show Thi, the first sponsored show on Indian television.
