History of April 16

- ♦ 1853: The first train in India ran between Mumbai and Thane.
- 1919: Gandhi announced a fast to pay homage to those who died in the Jallianwala Bagh massacre.
- ♦ 1978 : Indian actress Lara Dutta was born.
- ◆ 2008: The statue of the Father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi was unveiled in London.
 - 1966: Nandlal Bose, a famous painter of India passed away.

Current Affairs Related to 16th April

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi will be honored with the Lata Deenanath Mangeshkar Award. This will be the first edition of these awards. This announcement was made by the Mangeshkar family. On April 24, PM Modi will receive the award at the upcoming Master Deenanath Mangeshkar Award ceremony. It is noteworthy that this day (April 24) is the 80th death anniversary of Lata Mangeshkar's father Master Dinanath Mangeshkar.
- According to data from the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, for the first time in the last 11 years, the number of domestic patent filings at the Indian Patent Office exceeded that of international filings. A total of 19796 patent applications were filed during the January-March quarter of 2022, which included 10,706 patents filed by Indian applicants and 9,090 patents by non-Indian applicants.
- India's first Made-in-India commercial aircraft is ready for its first commercial flight. This made-in-India aircraft has been named Dornier 288. It will start its operations from Dibrugarh in Assam to Pasighat in Arunachal Pradesh. This initiative will boost connectivity in the northeastern states. It is worth mentioning that the development of the North-East region is of strategic importance and this region is included in the Ude Desh ka Aam Nagrik (UDAN) scheme.
- The third edition of the Tree City of the World list has been released. Mumbai and Hyderabad have been recognized as the 2021 Tree Cities of the World. These cities have been recognized by the Food and Agriculture Organization and the Arbor Day Foundation. Apart from Hyderabad and Mumbai, 136 other cities in 21 countries have been included in the list. Mumbai has been recognized for its commitment to growing and sustaining urban trees and greenery in building a clean, resilient and happy city.
- ♦ Madhya Pradesh Governor Mangubhai Patel and Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan have reached the Champions of Change Madhya

- Pradesh 2021 program organized by Interactive Forum on Indian Economy at Kushabhau Thackeray Auditorium, Bhopal.
- Foreign Secretary Harsh Vardhan Shringla will take over as the Chief Coordinator of the G20 next month, the government officially announced. The appointment is significant as India will assume the presidency of the G20 from Indonesia on 1 December 2022 and will host the G20 Leaders' Summit for the first time in India in 2023. Series will retire on 30 April 2022, handing over the charge to Foreign Secretary-designate VM Kwatra, who is currently India's ambassador to Nepal. G20 Sherpa will continue as Indian Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal.
- ♦ South American country Ecuador has become the first country in the world to give legal rights to wild animals. The country's highest court has ruled in favor of a case that centered on a woolly monkey named Estrelita, who was taken from her home to a zoo, where she died within a month.
- ♦ The Airports Council International released its list of the top 10 busiest airports worldwide for 2021. Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport topped the list with 75.7 million passengers. Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport with 62.5 million passengers ranks second, followed by Denver International Airport, in third place.
 - The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs has launched the Svanidhi Se Samridhi program in 126 cities in addition to 14 States/Union territories. The Quality Council of India is the implementation partner for the programme. It is an additional program of PM Svanidhi Yojana, which was launched on January 4, 2021 in 125 cities to identify the socioeconomic profiles of PM Svanidhi beneficiaries and their families.
- The Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology has launched an indigenous onboard Driver Assistance and Warning System Bus Signal Priority System and Common Smart I-OT connectivity software.
