#### **History of May 21**

- ♦ 2003: More than 190 countries of the world ratified the International Treaty on Tobacco in Geneva.
- ♦ 1966: Renowned soft drink company Pepsi has announced the world's first to make an ad film in space.
- ◆ 2006 : Congress rally in Srinagar attacked.
- ◆ 1991: Rajiv Gandhi, the ninth Prime Minister of India, passed away.
- ◆ 1840 : Formed part of the British Colony in New Zealand.
- ♦ 1931 : India's famous satirist Sharad Joshi was born

#### **Current Affairs Related to 21th May**

- The Cotton Council of India will be constituted under the chairmanship of Suresh Kotak. It will include representatives from Textiles, Agriculture, Commerce, Cotton Corporation of India, Cotton Research Institute and Ministry of Finance. The first meeting of the Cotton Council of India will be held on 28 May 2022.
- Regional Center for Skill Development, Rehabilitation and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Shillong. The Government of India has established CRCs in different parts of the country especially in the North Eastern States. It is situated on about 10 acres of land given by the Government of Meghalaya at Monfort Building, Dhankheti Shillong.
- The Ministry of Skill Development has partnered with the Indian School of Business for capacity building programmes. About 120 officers, 30 per batch, will undergo extensive five-day training at ISB Hyderabad. The first batch of 30 1 officers has completed training from ISB Mohali campus. An MoU has also been signed between the Ministry of Skill Development and the Indian School of Business. The primary goal of the program is to strengthen leadership skills.
- ♦ A British mountaineer Canton Cool has scaled the world's highest mountain for the 16th time. And he has become the first foreign climber to climb Mount Everest the most. Canton also holds the record for the first British elimber to have climbed Mt Nuptse, Mt Everest and Mt Lhotse in a single season in 2013.
- Ashoka Trust for Research in Ecology and Environment, has been elected to the US National Academy of Sciences. The election is a reaffirmation of our important work on the ecology, conservation and management of tropical forests that are declining around the world but vital to the well-being of humanity. He is also an elected fellow of the Royal Society and the American Philosophical Society.

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched India's first 5G testbed, allowing startups and industry players to test and certify their technologies domestically and reduce dependence on foreign facilities. The testbed was built at a cost of around 220 crores. 5G Testbed IIT was built as a collaboration project between eight institutions led by Madras.
- The Union Minister Shri Ashwini Vaishnav inaugurated the National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology Centers in Leh and Kargil and Incubation Center at Leh. The NIELIT Center at Leh will play an important role in enhancing the competence of the Union Territory. It will enhance the digital literacy of the Union Territory of Ladakh. The local population of Kargil will be benefited by the NIELIT center located in Kargil.
- Former Chief Election Commissioner Sunil Arora has been named as the new non-executive chairman of the Village Unnati Board. Arora is a retired civil servant with more than 36 years of experience. He has served as the secretary of two important ministries, the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship. Became the 23rd Chief Election Commissioner of India. He also serves as the President of the Association of World Election Bodies. He is a 1980 batch retired Indian Administrative Service officer of Rajasthan cadre.
- Eicher Motors has appointed B Govindarajan as the Chief Executive Officer of Royal Enfield. He will also serve as a Whole Time Director on the Board of Eicher Motors Limited. Govindarajan was serving the company as Executive Director since August 2021, before joining as Chief Operating Officer since 2013. Royal Enfield is an Indian multinational motorcycle manufacturing company headquartered in Chennai, Tamil Nadu, India.
- ◆ India hosted the SCO RATS meeting in New Delhi.


