- ◆ **1526** : Babur, the ruler of the Mughal Empire, defeated the Sultan of Delhi and became the new emperor.
- ◆ **1878** : The University of Calcutta gave the first approval for women to be eligible for university education.
- ◆ **1972** : Spacecraft Apollo 16 returned to Earth.
- ◆ **1960** : National Defense College was established in New Delhi.
- ◆ **1748** : The Mughal ruler Muhammad Shah died in Delhi.
- ◆ **1920** : Famous freedom fighter Manibhai Desai was born.

Current Affairs Related to 27th April

- ◆ **Eminent economist Suman K. Berry** has been appointed as the next Deputy Chairman of NITI Aayog. The appointment of Suman Berry has been approved after the resignation of outgoing Vice President Rajiv Kumar. Rajiv Kumar's resignation has been accepted by the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet, but he will continue in the post till 30 April 2022. It is worth noting that Rajiv Kumar took over in August 2017 in place of the then vice-president Arvind Panagariya. Now Suman Berry will take over as the new Vice President from 1 May 2022.
- ◆ **Bharat Yuvah** announced that **Ashwin Yardi**, CEO of Capgemini in India, has joined the organization, starting immediately with Yasumasa Kimura, UNICEF representative, as co-chair of the organization. Yuvah Board now acts as a decision making body
- ◆ **Indo American Chamber of Commerce** has selected **Indian-American CEO of General Atomics** Global Corporation **Vivek Lal** for the prestigious Entrepreneurial Leadership Award in recognition of his contribution to the defense sector. The Indo American Chamber of Commerce was established in 1968 and is the premier bilateral chamber for Indo-US commercial cooperation.
- ◆ **Babita Singh** a serial entrepreneur was named **Global Peace Ambassador** for her work in promoting peace through education, sports, arts, culture and diplomacy at the India International Conclave 2022 organized in collaboration with Asia Africa Consortium in New Delhi.
- ◆ **The Parliamentary Standing Committee on Science and Technology and Environment, Forest and Climate Change** presented its report on the proposed Wildlife Amendment Bill 2021. The Standing Committee has observed that certain species, which have been proposed by the Ministry of Environment, have been excluded from the various Schedules of Wildlife and Plants and recommended a revised list of Schedules to include these species.
- ◆ **The Stockholm International Peace Research Institute** released the **World Military Expenditure Report 2021** on the annual expenditure of the armies of the world's major countries. According to the report, world military spending reached an all-time high in 2021 with US\$ 2.1 trillion. According to this, the total global Sanche spending increased by 0.7 percent to reach US\$ 2113 billion in 2021. America is at the top of the countries with the highest military spending.
- ◆ **Prime Minister Narendra Modi** inaugurated the **Raisina Dialogue**. This is the seventh edition of this dialogue. Organized this dialogue in direct format from 25 to 27 April 2022. European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen is its chief guest.
- ◆ **The Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare** organized the **National Conference** of Cluster Based Trade Organization under the Central Sector Scheme of Formation and Promotion of 10,000 Farmer Producer Organizations. The scheme was launched in February 2020 at Chitrakoot with a budgetary provision of Rs.6865 crore.
- ◆ **The Wisden Almanack** has named **India captain Rohit Sharma** and **bowler Jasprit Bumrah** among the five best cricketers of the year for 2022. Rohit Sharma scored 368 runs in four Tests at an average of 52.57, completing an outstanding tour with 127 runs in the second innings at The Oval, his maiden Test century away from home. Other players include England pacer Ollie Robinson, South African women's player Dane van Niekerk and New Zealand opener Devon Conway.
- ◆ **Tripura State Government** signed a **Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)** with **NIXI-CSC Data Service Center** to set up an International Grade Data Center in the state. National Internet Exchange of India and CSE E Governance Services Limited have formed a joint venture named **NIXI-CSC Data Services Center** to set up a projected data center.

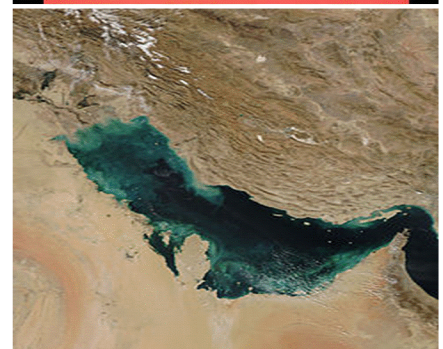
